A New Dawn for Nigisti Atsebha

At the age of 55, Nigisti Atsebha's has found new hope. Nigisti lives in the village of Tahtay Adekisandid, Metsequo, within the Kilite Awlaelo district and she heads a family of eight. Nigisti's circumstances have been transformed by the establishment of a new water point - funded by WellWishers and constructed with the support of WellWishers long-term local partner the Relief Society of Tigray (REST). This key development is steering her household toward a more promising and modern way of life, with each passing day bringing a glimmer of hope.

Reflecting on the difficult years gone by, Nigisti recounts the struggles of survival in a community where families shared open water sources with livestock.

"We all drank from the same muddy spots where dogs, goats, and humans crowded together, fostering an environment ripe for the rapid spread of disease. The dry season brought even greater challenges; as nearby rivers ran dry, the only option was a gruelling two-hour trek to another unprotected water source - exposed to dirt and danger".

With access to clean water provided by REST and funded by WellWishers, life has taken a significant turn. Nigisti's burdens have begun to lift. She now fetches six or more jerry cans daily to meet her family's needs without fear of contamination. The availability of safe water has freed her time, allowing her to engage in social activities and income-generating projects such as poultry farming and sheep rearing.

"Thank you, REST and WellWishers, for realizing my dream," she expresses with heartfelt gratitude. "My hope is shining brighter than ever".

Recognizing the importance of sustainability, Nigisti is committed to protecting this vital resource. She is working to influence her community to contribute sufficient monthly fees for maintenance, as well as participate in fencing and regular cleaning of the water point. "From now on, I will pay my share and encourage others to do the same," she asserts confidently.

As the current population of 165 relying on this water point continues to grow, Nigisti emphasizes the urgent need for additional water sources. "However, we are immensely grateful for the support from REST and WellWishers".
